

## **State Bank of India (Probationary Officers) Syllabus**

The State Bank of India PO Syllabus has been divided into three parts

### **➤ Objective Type Test : (Time : 2 Hours & Marks - 200)**

The duration of objective type test will be 2 hours max.

The test will consist of 200 marks. Following will be included in the test.

- Test of English Language (Grammar, Vocabulary, Comprehension etc.)
- Test of General Awareness, Marketing & Computers
- Test of Data Analysis & Interpretation
- Test of Reasoning (High Level)

The candidates are required to qualify in each of the Tests by securing passing marks, to be decided by the Bank.

### **➤ Descriptive Test: (Time 1 Hours & Marks - 50)**

The Descriptive Test will be of 50 Marks with 1 hour duration. Test of English Language (comprehension, short précis, letter writing & essay)” The candidates are required to qualify in the Descriptive Test by securing passing marks, to be decided by the Bank.

## **2. Phase-II : Group Discussion & Interview : Max Marks - 50 (GD - 20, Interview - 30)**

The aggregate marks of objective and descriptive test will be arranged in descending order and the candidate who have qualified in both the written tests will be called for group discussion and interview depending upon the vacancies in each category, subject to maximum of 3 times of the vacancies.

## **3. Final Selection**

The marks of group discussion & interview will be put together and the candidates who secure minimum 40% marks (minimum 35% in case of SC/ST/OBC/PWD) in group discussion and interview will be considered for final selection.

The candidates will have to qualify in Phase I and Phase II separately. Marks obtained by the candidates in Written Test out of 250 marks (maximum) are normalized to 75 and marks obtained in GD/ Interview out of 50 are normalized to 25, final merit list is arrived at after totalling the normalized marks as above with an aggregate of 100. The selection will be made from the top merit ranked candidates in each category. Phase I & Phase II marks after normalisation will be aggregated and arranged in descending order (category wise) for candidates who have qualified in both the phases separately & depending on the vacancies, selection will be made from the top merit ranked candidates in each category. Results of the candidates who have qualified for Phase II and thereafter the list of candidates finally selected will be available on the Bank's website in addition to publication in Employment News / Rozgar Samachar.
